Lichens are partnerships between fungi and photosynthetic algae or cyanobacteria. They lack roots and protective waxy surfaces; instead, they absorb water and dissolved substances directly across much of their bodies. This feature allows them to survive on bare rock and tree bark, but it also exposes them to pollutants in the air. Sulfur dioxide, nitrogen compounds and certain metals can reduce growth, damage photosynthesis or favour some lichen species over others. For that reason, ecologists have long used lichen communities as biological indicators of air quality.

A survey does not simply ask whether lichens are present. Some species tolerate polluted or nutrient-rich conditions, while others disappear quickly. Researchers record which species occur, how much surface they cover and sometimes the concentration of chemicals in their tissues. Patterns are compared with measurements from instruments and with information about traffic, industry, rainfall and bark chemistry. Because winds and local moisture influence exposure, two sites the same distance from a road may not have identical communities.

Lichens offer advantages: they integrate conditions over weeks or months and can reveal spatial patterns where continuous monitoring equipment would be too expensive. Yet they cannot identify a single pollutant or its exact concentration without calibration. A decline may also result from drought, habitat loss or changes in the trees that support the lichens. Consequently, biomonitoring is most informative when repeated over time and combined with physical measurements. Its value lies not in replacing sensors but in showing how living organisms respond to the mixture of conditions they actually experience.

Repair cafés are community events where volunteers help visitors diagnose and fix broken household objects. People bring lamps, small appliances, clothing, bicycles or electronics; tools are shared, and the repair is performed with the owner rather than hidden in a workshop. The immediate objective is to keep an item in use, but organisers also aim to transfer practical knowledge and challenge the assumption that replacement is always easier than repair.

The events reveal why repair can be difficult. A failed component may cost little, yet the case may be glued shut or the manufacturer may not provide diagrams and spare parts. Digital locks can prevent a replacement part from working until it is paired with proprietary software. In other cases, the obstacle is not design but diagnosis: a symptom may have several causes, and volunteers must decide whether further testing is safe. Not every object can or should be repaired; damaged batteries and devices connected to mains electricity require particular caution.

Counting successful fixes alone can underestimate the impact. A visitor whose appliance cannot be saved may learn how to maintain the next one or what features make a future purchase repairable. Records from many events can also reveal recurring failures and support calls for longer warranties, access to parts and product designs that can be opened without destruction. Repair cafés do not replace professional technicians or solve the economic pressures that make new products cheap. They do, however, turn repair from an isolated consumer problem into a shared source of evidence and skill.

Wooden ships, tools and buildings can survive for centuries in oxygen-poor sediments where organisms that normally decay timber are inactive. Once excavated, however, waterlogged wood is extremely unstable. Much of its original cellular material may have disappeared and the spaces are filled with water. If the object is allowed to dry untreated, surface tension can pull the weakened structure inward, causing shrinkage, cracking and irreversible distortion.

Conservators therefore replace or support the water before drying. One common treatment introduces polyethylene glycol, a water-soluble wax, gradually so that it penetrates the wood. Large objects may remain in treatment tanks for years. After impregnation, freeze-drying removes frozen water by sublimation, reducing the forces that would occur during ordinary evaporation. Other methods use sugars or resins, and the choice depends on the species, thickness, degree of degradation and salts present.

Treatment does not end when the object appears dry. Residual salts can react with oxygen and moisture to form acids, and consolidants can change as they age. Conserved wood must be monitored for movement, surface deposits, acidity and changes in humidity. Samples and treatment records are preserved because future conservators may need to understand what entered the wood before attempting another intervention. The long timescale is not merely a technical inconvenience: it reflects an ethical effort to stabilise the object without erasing evidence or preventing future study.
