In many drylands, the open spaces between shrubs are not bare. Their uppermost millimetres may be occupied by communities of cyanobacteria, lichens, mosses, fungi and other microorganisms collectively known as biological soil crusts, or biocrusts. Filaments produced by some cyanobacteria bind loose particles together, reducing erosion by wind and water. Other members of the community can contribute nitrogen or alter how rainfall enters the soil. These effects are important in landscapes where plant cover is sparse and nutrients are limited.

Biocrusts are easily overlooked because young communities may be pale and nearly invisible. Mature crusts can become darker or form a rough surface, but appearance alone does not reveal every ecological function. A site may regain some soil stability before its lichen and moss diversity returns. Conversely, a dark surface may indicate a species composition different from the one that existed before disturbance. Trampling, off-road vehicles and intensive grazing can break the crust, and recovery may take years or decades because growth is slow and rainfall is unpredictable.

Restoration experiments sometimes spread cultured cyanobacteria or small fragments of intact crust onto damaged ground. Success depends on matching organisms to local soil and climate and on preventing renewed disturbance. Researchers therefore monitor several indicators, including surface strength, erosion, nitrogen fixation and species composition, rather than relying on colour alone. Biocrusts can improve dryland resilience, but they are not a uniform layer that performs the same role everywhere. Effective management requires attention both to the functions that return quickly and to the components that recover much more slowly.

Researchers who study everyday behaviour often ask people how much time they spend working, caring for relatives, travelling or using media. A single retrospective question is inexpensive, but respondents must compress many different days into one estimate. Routine activities may be forgotten, socially valued activities may be exaggerated, and short episodes are easily omitted. Time-use diaries address some of these problems by asking participants to record what they were doing during successive intervals of a particular day.

Diaries provide detail that a broad survey question cannot. They show the order of activities, simultaneous tasks and differences between weekdays and weekends. Yet the method introduces its own difficulties. Completing a diary requires effort, so participants may leave gaps or use vague categories. People who are especially busy may be less likely to respond, which can bias the sample. Recording an activity may also change it: someone prompted repeatedly about phone use might reduce it during the study. Researchers call this possibility reactivity.

Smartphone-based diaries can send reminders and attach time stamps, but technology does not eliminate the need for careful design. Frequent prompts improve recall while increasing burden; infrequent prompts are easier to tolerate but invite reconstruction from memory. Analysts must decide how to treat missing intervals and whether one or two observed days represent a person's usual schedule. For this reason, diary data are often combined with interviews, passive sensors or repeated observation. The method is valuable not because it produces a perfect record, but because it makes the strengths and limitations of behavioural measurement more visible.

In the ocean, light is absorbed rapidly, but sound can travel over long distances. Passive acoustic monitoring takes advantage of this difference by placing underwater microphones, called hydrophones, in fixed locations or on moving platforms. The instruments listen without transmitting a signal. They may record whale calls, fish choruses, rainfall, ice movement and the noise of ships, producing a soundscape that can be examined long after fieldwork has ended.

Continuous recordings are useful when animals are difficult to observe visually or when weather prevents surveys. A call can show that a species was present even if no researcher saw it. However, a recording rarely reveals everything investigators want to know. The same type of call may be produced by several individuals, and silence does not prove absence because an animal may be present but not vocalising. Sound propagation also changes with water temperature, depth, seafloor shape and background noise. Consequently, a call detected at one site cannot be converted directly into a population estimate.

Researchers address these limitations by using arrays of hydrophones, which allow the direction or position of a sound source to be estimated from differences in arrival time. They also calibrate instruments, model how sound travels and compare acoustic records with visual observations or environmental sensors. Automated classifiers can scan thousands of hours of data, but their errors must be checked, especially when novel sounds resemble known calls. Passive acoustics greatly expands the temporal scale of marine observation, yet reliable interpretation depends on understanding both animal behaviour and the physical conditions through which sound travels.

Many ancient stone sculptures that appear white today were originally painted. Weathering, burial, cleaning and earlier restoration removed much of the colour, while the prestige later attached to unpainted marble encouraged viewers to treat whiteness as the intended state. Traces of pigment can nevertheless survive in protected grooves or as particles too small to be seen with the naked eye.

Researchers use several methods to investigate these traces. Ultraviolet light may reveal patterns where different materials fluoresce, infrared imaging can distinguish some carbon-based details, and spectroscopy can identify minerals without removing a sample. Microscopic analysis of tiny fragments may show the order in which paint layers were applied. Each method has limits: a pigment may have altered chemically, an adhesive may resemble an original material, and the absence of a detectable colour does not prove that a surface was never painted.
